Training

Educational programmes and talks are offered to staff to enable them to develop practices which enable all children to flourish.

Curriculum

The curriculum offered at Parkview Pre-Primary encourages children to develop positive



attitudes to people who are different from themselves. It encourages children to empathise with others.

This is done by:

- making children feel good about themselves
- celebrating a wide range of festivals
- creating an environment of mutual respect and tolerance
- developing the children's social and emotional intelligence

- Avoiding stereotypes in the selection of learning materials and equipment.
